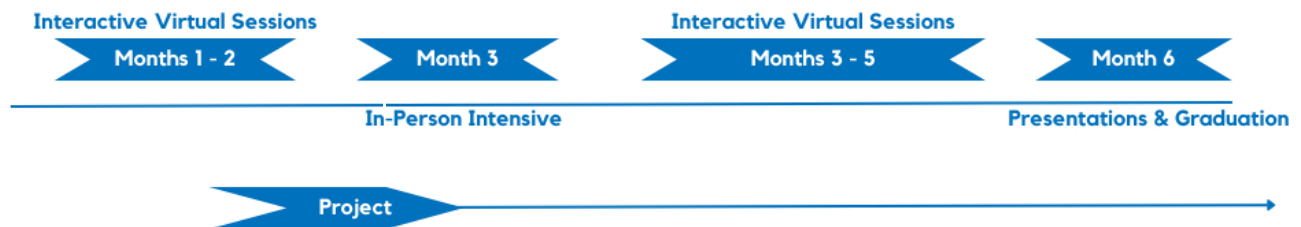
Curious about LLEAD?

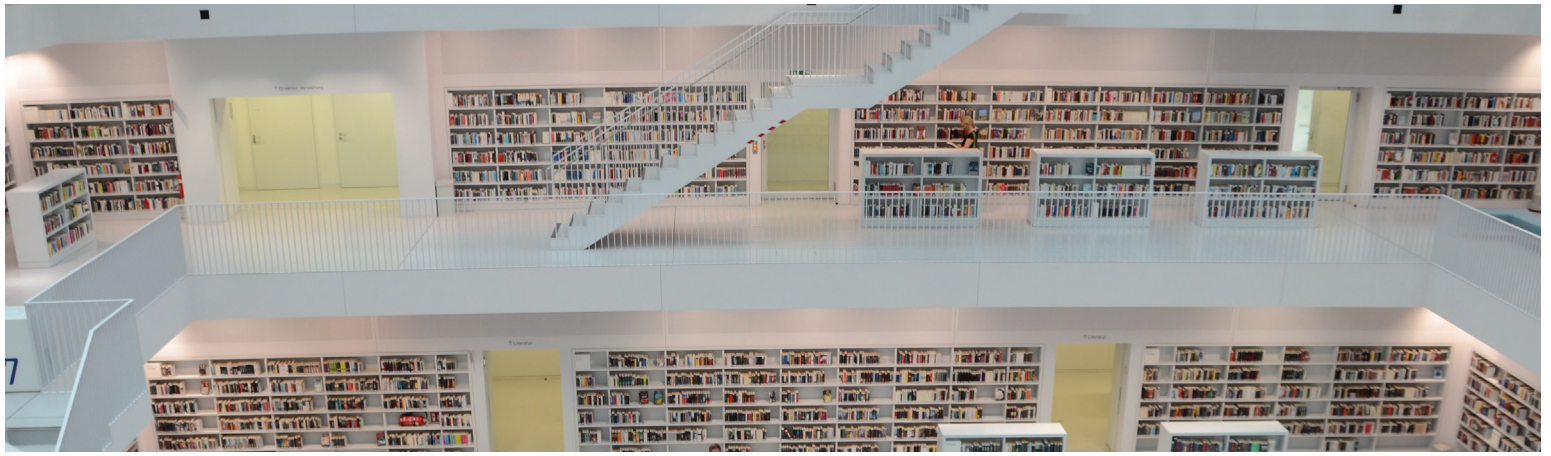

YOUR PROJECT:

You are expected to lead a project addressing a need or issue for your organization or for the sector.

Why? A project is an ideal way for you to apply and practice the tools and concepts you are learning within LLEAD's supportive environment with instructors, your cohort and highly experienced learning guides. Your project is to be sponsored by your manager or a sector leader.

And, no, you aren't expected to complete the project during LLEAD. Phew!

FEES: LLEAD8 is \$6,599CAD (~\$4,786USD)

Covers the full program, including the in-person Intensive at University of Waterloo in Ontario, less travel expenses. Travel is not included. Financial support is available.

APPLY TODAY: Registration is limited to 20 participants.

Your application has 4 parts:

1. Application Letter
2. Resume
3. 2 Letters of Support – one from a senior leader in your organization or profession and – one from your direct manager
4. Bursary or Fellowship application (if applicable)

EXAMPLES OF PROJECTS UNDERTAKEN BY LLEAD STUDENTS:

- Virtual training and learning site for a large library's employee development program, from onboarding new employees to tech training and onto leadership development options
- Comprehensive needs assessment for an additional library facility identifying potential locations, service delivery model, communication plan, etc.
- Proposal for the creation of a new division at a research university library to integrate research data management, digital publishing, data services, digital repositories, and preservation
- Report on and recommendations for a government IM department's program performance measures and metrics
